#### (22/03/1926 to 8 /7/2016)

On 8 July 2016, Phat (commonly known by many in Hamilton), Waikato Chinese Association Life Member passed away peacefully at the West Garden Rest Home in Hobsonville, at a golden age of 90.

Phat was born in Vietnam. Although Chinese, his name was pronounced and written in Vietnamese. In 1953 and 1959 he went to France and America respectively to study radio

Through the help of his younger sister and her family (who immigrated to New Zealand three years before him), Phat immigrated to New Zealand in 1982 and reunited with his sister and her family in Hamilton.

Phat worked for Gallagher Holdings until he retired. He then worked for Forlongs only on Saturdays attending to Chinese customers.

Phat joined Waikato Chinese Association (WCA) in the 1980s. He was a dedicated committee member for many years – involving in lion - dance activities, newsletter translation, fund-raising for the Chinese Gardens, Chinese Community Hall, to name a few.

In 1989, Phat became a committee member of the Waikato Chinese Heritage Group. He taught Cantonese to Chinese children and undertook other cultural activities in that Group for a few years.

Phat also devoted his time in the service of others, particularly the migrant community. Phat was a Justice of Peace, an interpreter at the Migrant resource Centre and President of the Vietnamese Association in Hamilton. He undertook many education and community work certificates; one of them is for food handling to help interpret in that area for many people in the Asian community taking the Course. Phat is fluent in five languages (English, Vietnamese, French, Mandarin and Cantonese)

In 2001 Pat received a Civic Award for being one of Hamilton's 'unsung heroes'.

Many may not know, when he was younger, Phat enjoyed ballroom dancing and won a medal in one of the ballroom dancing competition

His health slowly deteriorated in his late 80s and he lived at West Garden Rest Home in Hobsonville, Auckland to be close to his sister and her family.
